- Welcome and Unveiling of new cemetery monument
- Commemoration of deportations of Lithuanians to Siberia. Lithuanian Ambassador to the U.S. will lay a wreath in honor of those deported.
- How the cemetery project began, what was accomplished, who contributed.
- Naming all those buried in the Lithuanian cemetery and where they came from, recognizing the descendants present from those families.

Program continues at the Polish-Lithuanian Cemetery

- Unveiling of the new Monument/Sign
- Singing of the Lithuanian and Polish anthems.
- A brief history of Polish-Lithuanian relations
- Reading of the names of those buried here and recognizing the descendants present from those families.
- Singing of a Lithuanian folk song by Julia Gelgazis and Laima Gaigalas.
- Placing of two wreaths of Ruta on the two graves of baby girls (Kurtinaityte and Zakeviciute) and the placing of flowers on the grave of Kazimieras Kurtinaitis by family members.

- Lunch, self hosted. Tour of Museum with Lithuanian items of interest marked.
- Singing at the Brick Tavern, 1:00 to 2:00 pm (open song time with accordion and other instruments)
 - Folk Dancing, 2:00 to 3:00 in front of the Miners Monument

(Two-hour open time to rest or go on tour of the Zakevicius factory in Cle Elum 3:30-4:00, Cle Elum cemetery with Lithuanian flags placed on graves (check out Rap Saviskas, Rap short for Rapuze)

- Dinner from 5:30 6:30 will be served at the Ronald Community Center (old school cafeteria). Bar hosted by the Croatian club will serve wine and beer from the Roslyn microbrewery
- Program begins at 7:00 in the old school Gym with the singing of seven songs; all songs will be introduced by a story about the Lithuanian miners. Total time of program approximately one hour.
